Our network is made up of 12 Feeding America foodbanks and 3,601 member food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and supplemental feeding programs, serving all of Ohio's 88 counties.


Together, our network distributed 229,546,132 pounds of food, or about 191.3 million meals, in 2019. That includes everything from fresh fruits and vegetables, dairy items, and meats and protein to breads, dry goods, and shelf-stable foods.

Those nearly 230 million pounds of food served Ohio families 3,438,315 times. Some of those households came to a food pantry just once for help in an emergency. Others came a handful of times when paychecks came up short. Still others rely on our network regularly for help. We strive to be there when they need us.

In total, we provided food to 9,458,206 individuals, including 2,871,974 children (30.4%), 4,689,228 adults (49.6%), and 1,897,004 seniors (20.0%).

THE OHIO FOOD PROGRAM AND AGRICULTURAL CLEARANCE PROGRAM

The Ohio Food Program and Agricultural Clearance Program is generously funded by the State of Ohio and administered by the Ohio Association of Foodbanks in partnership with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. It provided 55.3 million pounds, or 46.1 million meals, of wholesome, nutitious foods to hungry Ohio families in 2019, at an average cost per pound of just \$0.2942.

Special thanks to our longtime partners at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction (ODRC), as well as the Ohio Soybean Council and Ohio Soybean Association, the Ohio AgriBusiness Association, and Crop Production Services, which donated the cost of crop inputs in 2019. Through our partnership, ODRC facilities grew 904,519 pounds of vegetables and yielded \$115,000 in proceeds from a soybean cash crop to reinvest in the program.


The Ohio Association of Foodbanks procures all OFPACP product and monitors compliance.

Storage and Distribution Cost: \$2,054,945

This funding is used by member foodbanks to store and distribute food. It also includes \$214,000 for PantryTrak.

Total Food Cost: \$16,517,555

OFPACP provides about a quarter of all of the food distributed statewide by Ohio's 12 Feeding America foodbanks.

WEEKEND MEALS

We provided kid-friendly, shelf-stable meals for children attending Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) sites to take home to eat over the weekend.

In 2019, we partnered with 30 SFSP sponsors to distribute weekend meals to about 10,000 children each week for 10 weeks.



RURAL DELIVERY MEALS

We provided a week's worth of kid-friendly, shelf-stable meals to children in rural counties identified as highneed and underserved by the traditional SFSP.


In 2019, we partnered with 9 organizations to provide weekly boxes of meals to about 4,400 children each week for 10 weeks.



MOBILE MARKETS

We distributed fresh fruits and vegetables and protein items to families with children participating in one of the other summer programs.

In 2019, we partnered with 13 organizations to distribute 334,632 pounds of nutritious food to low-income families at an average cost of just \$0.51 per pound.

Last year, members secured \$207,642 in cash donations and \$179,317 worth of in-kind donations for \$386,959 in total donations.

More than \$4.5 million in donations, including \$2.6 million in cash and \$1.9 million in-kind, have been raised since inception.



VISTAs recruited 1,981 community volunteers who served 5,897 hours last year. Since inception, nearly 41,000 volunteers have been recruited and more than 345,000 hours served.

VISTA members also trained 1,199 staff/volunteers, developed 157 new systems or processes, and conducted 356 outreach events or presentations last year.



Members develop programs, systems, and processes that promote improved household security. Last year, their efforts led to more than 4,000 individuals receiving financial literacy services and more than 23,400 individuals receiving education or referrals related to improving food security and reducing hunger.

In summer 2019, VISTA Summer Associates helped their host sites to serve 405,000 summer meals, recruit 600 volunteers, and reach 2,500 new kids.

We partner with the Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services on a Work Experience Program (WEP) which connects unemployed, ablebodied adults without dependents to work experience opportunities.

Since 2013, we have completed more than 12.000 assessments to identify work readiness and barriers to employment. Our WEP staff places participants into work experience slots at about two dozen community-based locations across Franklin County.

Participants receive valuable job training and opportunities for vocational education, while complying with their work requirements to maintain eligibility for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits.





The Ohio Association of Foodbanks was proud to be the home of The Ohio Benefit Bank™ for 13 years. The Ohio Benefit Bank (OBB) was designed to break down the barriers that often keep families from getting the help they need. Through the use of a sophisticated online platform, low- and moderate-income households could apply for federal and state benefits or file tax returns on their own or with the help of one of thousands of trained staff and volunteers throughout Ohio.

We were deeply disappointed that Communally, developers of The Benefit Bank platform, were forced to file for bankruptcy and dissolve the program. Unfortunately, with the disinvestment in community-based assisters by the State of Ohio and other states, this safe, secure, and no-cost tool for stabilizing household incomes was no longer sustainable.

From its inception in 2006 to its closure in 2019, the OBB network served **1.1** million people in **730,000** households. Through the OBB, Ohio families were connected to **\$1.98** billion in potential work support programs and tax credits, including food assistance, health coverage, the Earned Income Tax Credit, federal student aid, home energy assistance, help with child care expenses, and much more. We are deeply grateful for the many partners who made the OBB such an overwhelming success for so long.
