NETWORK SNAPSHOT



Our network of 12 Feeding America foodbanks and 3,785 member hunger relief agencies and programs provided 290,980,342 pounds of food, or 242 million meals, from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021.

Collectively, the Ohio Association of Foodbanks statewide network served 3,860,313 households. Our member foodbanks provided 242,483,618 meals to 10,259,963 households members, including 2,987,803 children (29.1%), 4,959,665 adults (48.3%), and 2,312,495 seniors (22.5%).

To calculate meals served, we utilize Feeding America's formula of 1.2 pounds of food per meal. Household service statistics represent duplicated counts, meaning that a family visiting multiple times during the year would be counted each time they receive food.






The Ohio Food Program is generously funded by the State of Ohio. It provides center-of-the-plate staple items, protein products, shelf-stable fruits and vegetables, and more. These foods are in high demand and often difficult to source through donated channels, but we can purchase them in bulk at much lower cost, keeping core foods on the shelves of Ohio's foodbanks and on the plates of Ohio households in need.

We administer the program in partnership with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, Ohio's 12 Feeding America foodbanks, and nearly 40 vendors, suppliers, and producers. In 2020, the program provided 16.6 million pounds of food, or 13.8 million meals, at an average cost per pound of just \$0.7819.

New Initiative: USDA Farm to Food Bank Project

In the inaugural year of the USDA Food and Nutrition Service's Farm to Food Bank Projects, we partnered with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services to leverage a grant to capture surplus milk products and repurpose them for Ohio foodbanks and clients

The Farm to Food Bank Project requires that the grant recipient secure donated commodities, which the USDA grant will then provide matching funds to process and transport. We were grateful to procure surplus "trim" cheese – what remains after exact weight bricks are cut for sale – from Hillandale Farms, Gilman Cheese Corp., and Maple Ridge Foods. After being shredded, The Wholesale Group transported the two-pound bags of cheese to Ohio foodbanks. Through this public-private partnership, we rescued 482,243 pounds of surplus cheese product and provided it to Ohio's foodbanks for \$1.75 per pound, a savings of roughly \$1.79 per pound compared to the current retail price.

The Ohio Agricultural Clearance Program is generously funded by the State of Ohio. It provides fresh, Ohio-grown fruits and vegetables at just pennies on the pound through partnership with dozens of farmers, growers, and producers throughout the state. These foods represent some of the most healthy, wholesome foods available in our network.

We administer the program in partnership with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, Ohio's 12 Feeding America foodbanks, and nearly 50 agricultural partners. In 2021, the program provided 24.6 million pounds of food, or 20.5 million meals, at an average cost per pound of just \$0.2917.

Partnership with the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction

We would like to particularly thank our longtime partners at the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction (ODRC) and the Ohio Penal Industries, as well as the Ohio Soybean Council and Ohio Soybean Association, the Ohio AgriBusiness Association, and Crop Production Services, which donated the cost of crop inputs in 2021. Through our partnership, 400 acres at Pickaway Correctional Institution yielded \$190,280 in proceeds from a soybean cash crop to reinvest in the program. We also partner with ODRC to provide Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) application assistance to restored citizens and to process hogs purchased from Hartford Junior Fair youth exhibits and donated by Englefield Oil Company and Duchess Shops, Heartland Bank, and Licking County Farm Bureau.

Coronavirus Food Assistance Program – Making Food Move

We provided extensive in-kind support to help coordinate the delivery and distribution of more than 25 million pounds of food through the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP), which ended in May 2021. The product available through CFAP was well-received by foodbanks experiencing high demand and by grateful clients, and although our time spent soliciting vendors and coordinating deliveries was not reimbursed by USDA or participating vendors, we were pleased to provide this service to help foodbanks and farmers better weather the ongoing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Feeding Kids and Feeding Curiosity with COSI

As part of the Ohio Distance Learning Initiative, we worked with the Center of Science and Industry (COSI) to launch their Learning Lunchbox project. Through this partnership, we began matching COSI with large-scale food distributions targeting families with kids across the state. Children and families visiting a drive-thru distribution for help with food also took home an enrichment kit with science-focused activities and educational information.







SUMMER MEALS PROGRAMS FOR KIDS

WEEKEND MEALS, RURAL DELIVERY MEALS, AND MOBILE MARKETS



Summer Weekend Meals Program

We provided kid-friendly, shelf-stable meals for children attending Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) sites or other emergency feeding programs to take home to eat over the weekend

In 2021, we partnered with 24 SFSP sponsors and emergency food providers to distribute weekend meals to about 10,000 children each week for 10 weeks.



Rural Delivery Meals Program

We provided a week's worth of kid-friendly, shelf-stable meals to children in rural counties identified as high-need and underserved by the traditional SFSP and other emergency food programs.

In 2021, we partnered with 9 organizations to provide weekly boxes of meals to about 4,400 children each week for 10 weeks. Many deliver the boxes directly to families in need.



Mobile Farmers Market Program

We distributed fresh fruits and vegetables and protein items to families with children participating in one of the other summer programs to enhance their household's access to wholesome foods.

In 2021, we partnered with 17 organizations to distribute 958,464 pounds of nutritious food to low-income families at an average cost of just \$0.5674 per pound.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on traditional school meals programs and SFSP, the USDA and the State of Ohio provided increased flexibility to schools and community organizations providing out-of-school-time meals to children. Some of this flexibility included providing federal reimbursement for meals served in non-congregate settings – meaning that for the first time, federal funds could be used to replicate the innovative, state-funded models we have implemented for a decade to fill known gaps in child nutrition programs. We focused 2021 programs on reaching kids, families, and communities most isolated and impacted by the pandemic.

NATIONAL SERVICE INITIATIVES

AMERICORPS VISTA, AMERICORPS VISTA SUMMER ASSOCIATES, AND AMERICORPS NCCC



AmeriCorps VISTA

Our core members serve in one-year, full-time positions at foodbanks, food pantries, health clinics, afterschool programs, community action agencies, and other nonprofit organizations. They engage in indirect service, building capacity at their host sites and resiliency within their communities.

In 2021, our VISTA members raised a remarkable \$3.5 million for their host sites, including \$2.4 million in monetary support and \$1.1 million worth of in-kind donations. They recruited 2,120 volunteers, developed 300 new systems and processes, conducted nearly 900 events and presentations, and engaged with hundreds of thousands of individuals through social media and storybanking.



AmeriCorps VISTA Summer Associates

In summer 2021, 61 passionate individuals spent their summers in full-time service at summer meals programs, community gardens, and other hunger relief initiatives. They provide both direct and indirect service to support their host sites, their missions, and the kids and families they serve.

With COVID-19 continuing to complicate safe access to meals and programming for kids, our members also had to be willing to adapt to challenging circumstances. They helped their sites to provide 651,000 meals and 68,500 snacks to kids in need. They connected 50,000 new children to summer meals programs, recruited 517 volunteers, and grew, harvested, or rescued 20,000 pounds of produce.



AmeriCorps NCCC

This branch of the AmeriCorps family engages young adults ages 18 to 26 in team-based service, traveling to different locations throughout their terms to respond to pressing needs, including natural and other disaster services. Given that the COVID-19 pandemic presented unique challenges to foodbanks, suppressing volunteer support at a time of historic and complex need, we were fortunate to place AmeriCorps NCCC teams at the Greater Cleveland Food Bank and the SE Ohio Foodbank & Kitchen to help surge support for their pandemic responses.

These hands-on volunteers were irreplaceable assets, helping to repack food, prepare meals, and support emergency distributions.

Focusing on Food Security as Part of a National Pilot with AmeriCorps

In the months following the onset of COVID-19, the nation looked on while the nation's foodbanks grappled with long lines of people on the brink of hunger. As part of the federal response to this crisis, exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, AmeriCorps – formerly the Corporation for National and Community Service – launched a pilot focused on addressing food security through national service.

We are one of four sponsors selected to participate in this pilot, which helped us to place 14 members in COVID-19 Response positions at Ohio foodbanks beginning in late 2020 and early 2021. These members helped their foodbanks to adapt, transitioning fundraising events to virtual, developing food delivery programs to combat isolation, launching new volunteer recruitment initiatives, and responding to salient community and organizational needs. Thank you, VISTA members!

Elevating the Future Workforce & Promoting Volunteerism

Throughout the 15 years we have served as a sponsor for national service programs, we have welcomed hundreds to our service family. We recently surveyed our alumni and received nearly 100 responses. Of those that responded, we found that 96 percent feel VISTA was beneficial to their career path; 94 percent would recommend national service to others; and 42 percent were offered a paid position at their host site upon completion of their term. National service is truly the pipeline for the future leaders in our sector and beyond!





CONNECTING OHIOANS TO RESOURCES

FRANKLIN COUNTY WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM, SNAP AND BENEFITS OUTREACH

Franklin County Work Experience Program

We partner with the Franklin County Department of Job and Family Services to operate a Work Experience Program (WEP) for adults receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits that are unemployed or underemployed. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the time limit on SNAP participation for unemployed adults has been waived; however, Ohio currently has mandatory "employment and training" for childless adults between 18 and 50. We transitioned our WEP to remote, providing virtual components for meeting employment and training requirements to maintain access to SNAP. Our WEP team has observed an increase in the number of individuals able to remain in compliance, as they can complete work readiness assessments and other assignments by phone and online, mitigating transportation barriers and stigma.

Each month, our team assesses an average of 100 new SNAP applicants for work readiness and barriers to employment. We help address those barriers we can, such as assisting clients with securing documents like birth certificates and connecting them to health coverage to address unmet medical needs. Especially as many adults in central Ohio and throughout the state and country have found themselves without steady employment in sectors like entertainment, retail, janitorial, and other service sectors due to the pandemic, we focus on providing voluntary access to paid training, certification, and licensure programs.




Benefits Outreach - SNAP, HEAP, and More

In partnership with seven regional foodbanks, and in collaboration with the USDA Food and Nutrition Service and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, we lead a statewide Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Outreach Plan. During the COVID-19 pandemic, this work has been more critical than ever as newly unemployed workers and isolated seniors and families turn to SNAP for the first time to help meet their nutritional needs. Enhanced benefits and some expanded eligibility for groups like income-eligible college students mean SNAP is even more meaningful in preventing hunger and promoting health.

We also partner with the Ohio Department of Development to conduct Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) outreach throughout our network and in partnership with the Veterans Comprehensive Assistance Program.

The pandemic necessitated new programs to address unmet needs, including the Pandemic EBT program for children that miss school-based meals due to COVID-19 related closures and quarantine. We have proudly worked alongside public and charitable partners to raise awareness about this and other available resources. Heading into the coming year, we are renewing our partnership with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to serve as federal health care Navigators, connecting uninsured Ohioans with affordable health coverage.



Promoting Access to In-Demand Careers

Work Experience Program (WEP) graduate Kenneth Warren completed a driver training course through Capital Transportation Academy, fully paid for by WEP. Kenneth passed his CDL test and now has his license. He immediately had a job lined up and has started training. Kenneth is hoping to go on solo trips soon. He desires to take Florida routes because it is one of his favorite states to which to travel.
