"Our VISTA member worked at two separate summer feeding sites; she increased the daily attendance from 16 (last year) to 62 (this year). That increase helped children in rural communities obtain nutritious meals throughout the summer months. Last year the total number of meals served at these two sites was 624, with our VISTAs help, this year we have increased that total number to 2,750."

"Our AmeriCorps VISTA service at The Foodbank had a great impact on the operations here at The Foodbank's Urban Garden. As a VISTA, he spent the majority of his service helping with our hydroponic greenhouse operations which allowed us to increase our output of lettuce for our neighbors from approximately 1,000 heads to 1,200 heads of lettuce distributed each week. We were also able to add an additional day of greenhouse volunteer opportunities which in turn allows us to distribute lettuce three days a week instead of two. He was able to assist with the planting of a variety of crops and helped in the harvesting and distribution of thousands of pounds of fresh produce from our outdoor beds this season. Overall, he was an incredibly valuable member of the team and was a key part of our success this summer! We greatly appreciated his service!"

"The summer AmeriCorps VISTA crew focused their efforts this summer on volunteer mobilization, food production, increasing food security, leveraging donations, sustaining community partnerships, and hosting youth programming. AmeriCorps VISTA members mobilized volunteers for the garden through significant social media outreach, campus news, direct communications with students living on campus, and correspondence with local community members. We hosted 32 community gardeners, including faculty, alumni, staff, and neighbors with plots. They cultivated over 50 different varieties of produce and harvested 2,208 pounds to donate. They hosted two Farm Stands on campus to disseminate food for free to students and raise funds for the garden by collecting donations from faculty and staff."
